I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The 2025 Lake City Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the <u>current rulebook</u>, and <u>current Compete USA handbook</u> as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website.

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules.

Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA® member, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. citizens, please refer to the <u>rulebook</u> for more information.

EXCEL SERIES INFORMATION:

Excel Series Competition: This competition has been selected by U.S. Figure Skating to be part of the 2025 Excel Series Competitions. While skaters do NOT have to be registered in the Excel Series with US Figure Skating to compete in these events at this competition, skaters interested in earning points toward an invite to participate in the Excel National Final and Festival, dates TBD in 2025, must complete the on-line Excel Series form (available here) and pay the required fee to U.S. Figure Skating by March 1, 2025 or the skater's first series competition, whichever is earlier. PNIC BASIC SKILLS SERIES

2024-2025 Pacific NW Basic Skills Series and Championship: If you have not signed up for the series, you will need to do so before your first competition by going to either the PNIC or OSC websites listed below. Skaters must compete in a minimum of 3 competitions throughout the series before the final deadline August 17, 2025. II. ELIGIBILITY

Singles: Excel and Well-Balanced Events:

details. The links to register are:

- Skaters must meet at least the minimum singles test requirements for the event's level. A skater's singles test level may be higher than the minimum requirement.
 - Skate Up: skaters may skate up one level higher than their minimum test requirement allows.
- Skaters may not register for an event level lower than allowed by their competitive floor. An athlete's competitive floor is set by one of the following scenarios:
 - If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the NQS series, the event level registered for in the most recent NQS will become the lowest level they may compete at in any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event.

- o If an athlete has a paid EMS series application for the Excel Series, the event level registered for in the most recent Excel series will become the lowest level they may compete in any Excel event. For Well-Balanced and Specialty events the skater will be permitted to register at one level lower than the "floor" set by their excel series entry.
- If an athlete has never had a paid EMS series application in the NQS or Excel series, the athlete may select their level based on their goals and technical skills as long as the minimum test requirements are met.
- Skaters are not permitted to enter an Excel free skate and a Well-Balanced free skate event at the same competition (example: Juvenile Girls Free Skate and Juvenile Girls Excel Free Skate). However, they are permitted to enter an Excel and a Well-Balanced event of different types such as a short program (if stand-alone event option), specialty or showcase events (example: Intermediate Women Short Program and Intermediate Women Excel Free Skate).

All other singles events:

- Skaters must meet the minimum test requirements for the events level, but not exceed the maximum permissible test requirement.

COMPLIANCE:

Coaches

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into two categories, Coach Compliance (includes choreographers) and Learn to Skate USA® Instructor Compliance. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found HERE. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

<u>Coaches of foreign athletes:</u> If you are a coach of a foreign athlete only, you are not subject to U.S. Figure Skating coach compliance and will only be asked to provide a letter of good standing for the federation your athlete represents.

Team Service Personnel

Teams are permitted a maximum of two team service personnel. Team service personnel must have a current U.S. Figure Skating or Learn to Skate USA® membership, a green lighted background check and completed SafeSport™ Training. All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions. Team service personnel is defined as those indicated as a team manager and/or team service personnel planning to attend the competition with the team.

Mandatory Athletes

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e., synchro, ice dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one Minor Athlete must complete SafeSport™ Training.

Minor athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ Training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

III. REGISTRATION INFORMATION

ONLINE REGISTRATION VIA EMS (Singles and Partnered events only):

All registrations will be handled through the EMS Portal. Online registrations will be accepted via EMS. Payment must be made at the time of registration by <u>credit card only</u>. Each transaction includes a 3% transaction fee.

Registration fees are by credit card only. Any contested credit card charges (or checks returned) will be charged a \$30 fee. Payment of any outstanding fees is required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or competition. All higher priced registration fees will be applied before any less expensive fees.

Waivers:

There are 3 waivers - all are required to be completed by ALL competitors. The three standard U.S. Figure Skating waivers are accessible via Members Only>Events>Competition Profile and must be completed prior to the competition.

Showcase Entries:

During registration, skaters must input their highest Singles Free Skate, Free Dance and Patterned Dance (solo and partnered) test levels passed to ensure placement in the correct showcase level in accordance with showcase guidelines.

Skater's Coaches:

Skaters must include in their registration the name of their primary coach accompanying them to the competition to ensure that their coach can be credentialed. Skaters may also include secondary coaches, but these coaches will not receive credentials. After the close of entries and thru May 14, notify the LOC of a coach change at sfsclakecityclassic@gmail.com.

Partnered Events:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.

Foreign Skaters:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition (<u>click here for HOW TO</u>). This can be done by choosing the "Non-Member? Create Account" option on the <u>Members Only</u> login page.

Test Credit:

Skaters requesting test credit must select the option "Test Credit" during registration or through the "Add Event" process within EMS by the registration deadline. After the registration deadline, requests can be made in person at the competition registration desk prior to skating event. Completed test credit packets will be available from the Registration/ Check-in desk shortly after the event concludes until the end of the competition. Payment of \$25 must be received prior to receiving skaters test credit packet.

Critiques/Feedback:

Critiques will be offered at this competition. Critiques must be requested by May 1, 2025. Send an email to the chief referee information is listed on the last page of this announcement.

Music Submission/Upload:

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD: Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to EMS no later than **05/1/2025** at **8:59 pm PDT**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$35 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite. Competition Backup Music:

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on a cell phone and it must be immediately available rinkside whenever the skater competes. If the phone does not have the standard round headset connector, an appropriate adapter, such as an Apple Lightning connector or Samsung USB-C adapter is required to be attached. The phone should be presented to the music person with the file ready to play, phone in airplane mode and volume turned to maximum.

Planned Program Content (PPC) Submission/Upload – For IJS Eevnets Only:

Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in EMS no later than **May 1, 2025 at 8:59 pm PDT**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a **\$35 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals, any PPC and music late fees assessed, or missed practice ice sessions. The online credit card fees are not refundable. All refunds will be returned to your credit card within 30 days of the end of the competition based on determination of the LOC that a refund is due.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

Facilities:

Frontier Ice Arena 3525 W. Seltice Way, Coeur d'Alene, ID www.frontiericearena.org

The competition will be hosted by the Spokane FSC and held at Frontier Arena located at 3525 Seltice Way, Coeur d'Alene Idaho. Indoor ice dimensions are 85' x 200' with rounded corners. All events will tentatively be held on Friday, Saturday & Sunday. No admission will be charged. All props used must be able to fit through a standard 36" x 85" hockey door. Storage of props and costumes at Frontier Arena is not allowed.

Locker Rooms and Changing Areas:

Locker rooms and changing areas at U.S. Figure Skating competitive events are for athletes only and will be labeled with regard to specific use and where identified will be gender specific. An exception can be made for athletes under 11 years old that will allow for one parent of the same sex to assist their child immediately prior to and after their skating event(s). Please review the Locker Room and Changing Area Policy in the SkateSafe Handbook.

The locker/changing room policy for this competition is as follows:

- All ready rooms in Frontier Ice Arena are co-ed.
- There will be private, secure, single person changing tents available.
- There are separate Men and Women restrooms WHICH ARE NOT available for changing.
- If there are concerns regarding this policy, the athlete should change prior to arriving at the arena.

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). Full details of the SkateSafe® Travel Policy and any exceptions can be found starting on page 12 of the SkateSafe® Handbook.

Official Website & Updates:

The official competition website is <u>spokanefigureskating.org</u>. An official bulletin board will be maintained near the on-site registration desk. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check the website and/or bulletin board frequently for any schedule changes and/or additional information pertaining to the competition. Starting orders and results will be posted online - the URL and its QR code to access will be posted near the on-site registration desk.

Schedule:

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

Practice Ice:

Sessions may be made available, schedule permitting, and will consist of 20-minute sessions for \$20. Practice ice sessions are available for pre-purchase online through EMS (see Appendix A) for purchase/selection. No refunds for practice ice will be issued for sessions not attended. Sales at the competition for any remaining spaces will be available with registration at the competition for \$25.

Onsite Check-In:

Check-in will open daily 90 minutes before the start of each day's ice time. Registration/check-in will be located inside the main entrance to Frontier Arena.

If you are participating in a role requiring compliance, please be sure to download or print your compliance card to verify your compliance status on-site, if requested. If you believe your compliance card does not accurately reflect your compliance status, please contact skatesafe@usfigureskating.org at least 2 business days prior to the competition for assistance.

Awards:

Awards will be presented at the awards desk shortly after the posting of results. Medals will be awarded for the top four places in each event. Compete USA events will have medals awarded to each skater in each event.

Dean Wiles Team Points Trophy:

The Dean Wiles Team Trophy will be awarded to the guest club with the most points at the end of the competition, using a scoring system for each event as follows: 1st place = 5 points, 2nd place = 3 points, 3rd place = 1 point, single skater events = 3 points.

Volunteer Info:

Competition runs on volunteers. Volunteer positions and their duties will be defined through our volunteer registration website starting in late March 2025. Volunteer requests will be emailed to all participants when available and will also be located on our official competition website. Certain positions will be identified requiring SkateSafe compliance.

Reminder: Compliant positions at all U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned events include key LOC members and ALL medical event personnel. To be considered compliant, an approved volunteer serving in one of these positions must:

✓ Must submit information for, proper payment of \$30 and successfully pass a background check* The background check will be valid for two seasons, the one in which it was completed plus one additional.

✓ Must complete annual SkateSafe Training. The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification *

Per U.S. Figure Skating Policy, photographing and/or recording anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited, and no flash photography is allowed while skaters on the ice in the indoor rink. Videotaping and photography is restricted to hand-held battery-operated equipment without tripod. Please be courteous to those viewing this event.
